# TARA TARA SAFETY COVER ORDER FORM A-B Point-to Point 

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## Point to Point Measurement Instructions

1. Establish two points, $A$ and $B$, at least $20^{\prime}$ or at least $2 / 3$ the length of the pool apart by marking the pool deck or driving two stakes (be sure that these 2 points stay fixed and do not move). The A point should always be in the shallow end. Place the points far enough away from the pool that an imaginary line extending through A and B in both directions does not cross the perimeter. There should be a margin of at least 3' between the imaginary line and the pool perimeter (4' for pools over 44' long).
2. Using chalk or dot stickers begin marking points along the perimeter of the pool wall in a counterclockwise direction. The marks should be at 2' to 3' intervals. Mark sharp radius at 1' to 2' intervals. Straight lines can be marked at $3^{\prime}$ to $4^{\prime}$ 'intervals. Mark all corner points, ladders, hand-rails, grab-rails, slide legs, rocks, spillways, spa walls, fill spouts, etc.
3. Measure and record distance from point $\mathbf{A}$ to point \#1, then point $\mathbf{A}$ to \#2, and so on for all the \# points around the pool. Then measure and record from point B to each of the \# points around all of the pool. List all of the measurements in the correct blank on the next page.
4. Measure the length and width of the pool at the waterline using 2 of your numbered points for each.
5. Draw a freehand sketch of the pool indicating the inside dimensions. Include the "A-B" line location, deck area, planters and any obstructions within 3 ' of the waterline. Please indicate on the drawing which side $\mathbf{A}$ \& B are on if you are standing at the shallow end. A photo of the pool is suggested when rocks, wateralls,
